

# Wheelers Hill Secondary College Dress Code

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline WHSC requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes. It has been developed in consultation with DET policy guidelines:

This dress code has been developed by WHSC School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

The Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support WHSC's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities.
- reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.
- provide a safe and inclusive environment for all students

The School Council has developed a dress code that we believe provides a range of choices for students and is cost effective for families and that options provided are not gender specific.

#### **SCOPE**

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while travelling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

#### **UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE**

Uniform items and appearance requirements should meet human rights and anti-discrimination requirements as well as health and safety considerations.

Our Dress Code aims to be non-discriminatory on the basis of gender or religion. Students and families should have access to uniform options which meet community expectations and the values of the College.

Option One: The full list of Example School's compulsory school uniform items available at Appendix A to this policy.

#### **General appearance**

While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, WHSC students must comply with the following:





- Uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- Uniforms must be clearly marked with the owner's name
- Additional layers of clothing may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth, provided these undergarments are completely hidden.
- Students should not vary from the School Dress options unless there are specific grounds to grant an exemption.

### **Jewellery and cosmetics**

Students are not permitted to wear decorative jewellery to school. Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, and watches, are the only acceptable jewellery.

Cosmetics should be kept to a minimum. Only clear or natural shade nail polish is permitted.

### **Hair and Sun Safety**

Hair and colouring must be appropriate to a school setting. Hair should be kept neat and tidy, and colour should be as natural as possible. **No extremes will be acceptable.** 

It is advised that students wear school approved hats or coverings during the summer months when outside

Hats should not be worn inside.

Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities. Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wraparound that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible

<u>Jackets</u>: Coloured jackets of any description are not to be worn over the school uniform, either at school or while travelling to or from school. The navy College softshell or polar fleece jacket is an option for all year levels.

<u>Tattoos</u>: It is against the law for people under 18 years old to obtain tattoos therefore they are not permitted. Year 12 students who turn eighteen before the end of their final year are advised to wait until they have finished school if they intend on getting any body art. If a student already has a tattoo, it will need to be covered.

<u>Footwear:</u> The required shoes for students are flat, black polishable, leather or leather-like lace-up or T-Bar school or business shoes. All black leather or leather-like sports shoes may be permitted as long as logos are discreet. Under no circumstances can students participate in workshop classes without correct school shoes, even on a casual dress day or with a uniform pass.

While uniform items are divided into summer and winter items, students are able to wear either summer or winter items at any time during the year as long as it is not a combination of summer and winter items. e.g. summer dresses are not to be worn with tights. Socks must be visible.

<u>Pants/Trousers:</u> Whether tailored or non-tailored, school pants or trousers do **not** include track or fashion pants. Approved uniform items must be purchased from the official WHSC Uniform Supplier, **Lowes** at Know Shopping Centre.

<u>Sports Uniform:</u> Students are permitted to wear correct Sports Uniform all day when they have a timetabled PE or Sports session or class. However, this does **NOT** include the following items:

- Black Leggings
- Non-sports uniform shorts that have trimming or logos
- Non-school hoodies, jackets, shirts or windcheaters
- Overtly coloured trainers
- Black tracksuit pants
- Caps or beanies with inappropriate advertising or logos





#### CASUAL DRESS DAY – DRESS CODE

On casual dress days the College has certain expectations about dress so that school programs are not interrupted and so students are safe.

The following provides a guide as to what students should wear on casual dress days.

- Clothing must not be revealing, for example does not reveal undergarments or excessive skin E.g. singlet tops.
- Skirts, dresses and shorts must be an acceptable length
- Footwear must be appropriate, for example covered shoes in Science and Technology classes. No thongs are to be worn. Jewellery/body piercing that poses a threat to health or is considered a safety risk should not be worn. Students will be asked to remove such items.
- Hats, caps or beanies must be removed during class or at the request of teachers. Exceptions for medical reasons will be considered by the Principal.
- Clothing or headwear with offensive or alcohol logos or language are not to be worn.

The College Administration reserves the right to disallow any items not addressed above but are deemed to be obscene, sexually suggestive, a danger to health and safety or offensive. If there is a breach of guidelines students may be excluded from class at the school's discretion.

#### Support for families experiencing difficulty

WHSC also has uniforms available to families to borrow on request.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

WHSC will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website, newsletter and student diary. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Dress Code, the following consequences will be put in place:

First time without a note	A warning will be issued to the student
Second time without a note.	Lunchtime detention on the day and recorded on school file.
Third Time	Lunchtime detention on the day and parents notified.
Subsequent occasions	Parents/Carer contacted, further disciplinary interventions- refer to Engagement and inclusion Policy.

Note: The Warning and Consequences Mechanism will be re-set each term.



#### **EXEMPTIONS TO STUDENT DRESS CODE**

We recognise that there may be situations where the application of this dress code may affect students unequally.

Students and their parents or carers may apply either in writing or in person to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic
  or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate particular economic hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents or carers.

**TOP** WHSC Polo shirt with logo, WHSC Rugby top with logo, WHSC Softshell jacket

**SHORTS** Navy blue only (Logo preferred)

**PANTS** Navy blue track pants

**SOCKS** White sport socks or navy blue football socks

**SHOES** Sport shoes with non-marking soles

Interschool sport students must wear full physical education uniform to and from College. Students who have a scheduled Physical Education class in Period 1 may come to school in full sport uniform. Students who have a scheduled Physical Education class in Period 4 may leave school in full sport uniform. For all other periods, students must change at school.





## PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

- Full school uniform should be worn neatly to and from school.
- White short sleave t-shirts may be worn under shirt but MUST NOT be visible or black.
